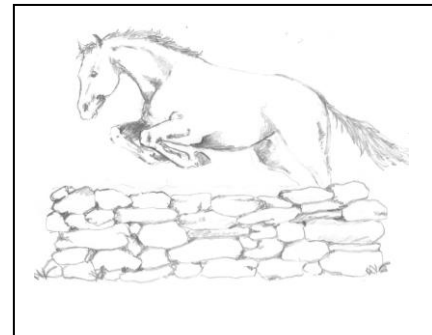
### Registration

### **Synopsis of Lifetime Contributions to the Profession**

Astute observations and practical experience over the past three plus decades has developed innovative concepts with regard to the biomechanics of the horse. What makes this approach unique is the development of specific external reference points which are based on the anatomy of the horse in the three dimensional form. These external references enable the farrier to correctly trim the foot and accurately apply a shoe with bio mechanical congruency, consistency and balance.

The external reference points of the Duckett Dot, Bridge, and Pillars will also help the horse owner and other health care professionals present a better understanding of how the foot should be shod for optimum efficiency and comfort. The external reference points presented are accurate and reproducible from the Shire to the Shetland. Therefore, the reproducibility of the Duckett technique serves as the foundation of good horseshoeing in all breeds and disciplines. The Dot, Bridge and the four weight bearing areas directly correlate with the bio mechanics with the lower limb. The overall results of employing these principals are illustrated almost immediately by the improvements in the horse movement followed by improved muscle tone and balance. These changes will also be reflected in improved posture, topline and the general demeanor of the animal overall. Restoring the biomechanical efficiency will directly relate to the overall improvements in the general health care and longevity of our horses and ponies with profound results.

## **Mark N Caldwell FWCF**

Mark Caldwell is a Fellow of The Worshipful Company of Farriers since 1987 and is currently the head of department of the School of Farriery Science Myerscough College Preston England. He also is a Post graduate research student at the school of Veterinary Clinical Science at the University of Liverpool studying common equine hoof metrics and their influence on hoof morphology. Mark qualified as a registered farrier in October 1981, gained his Associateship (AWCF) in 1984. He has competed both nationally and internationally as a member of the English National Farrier Team in 1987, 1997, and 2000, and served as the resident farrier at the University of Liverpool 1985 - 1996. Mark have been an examiner for the Worshipful Company of Farriers and have lectured in several countries in addition to having published several peer reviewed papers and numerous articles on farriery related subjects.
